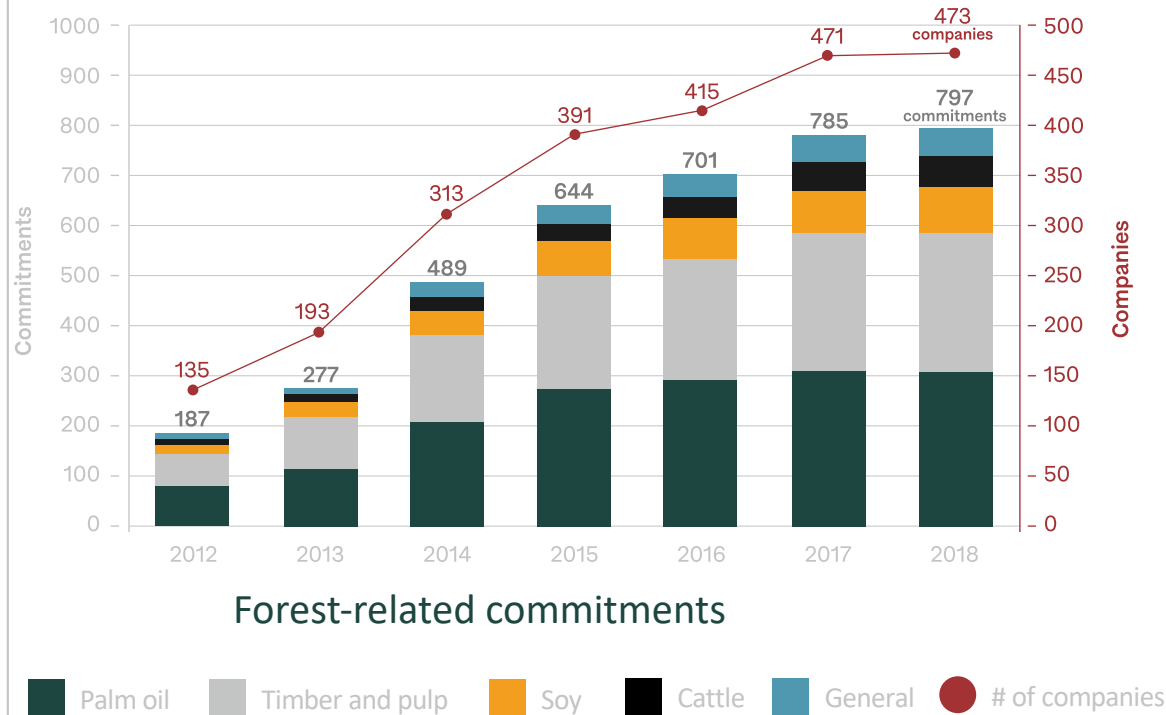

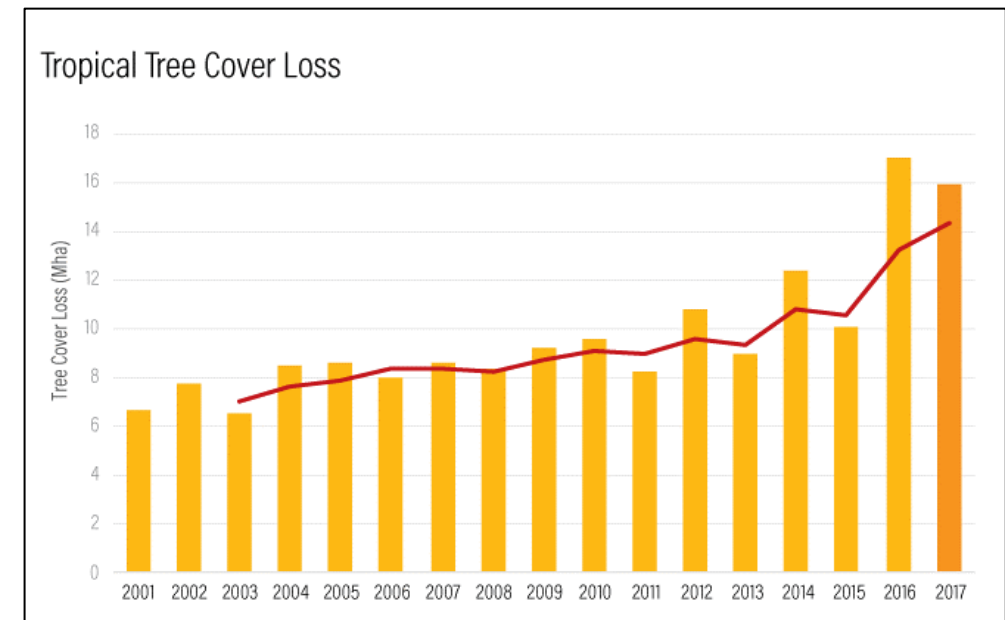
# The implementation gap

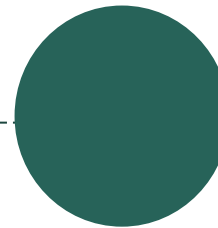

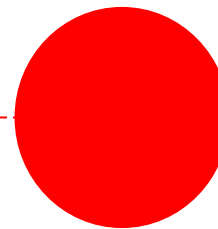


Two very different takes from different  
scorecards on whether this company is 'ethical':



## **Palm oil scorecard rating A**

Example: Has substantial traceability of palm oil to the plantation level. Participates in initiatives to reform the palm oil industry. Publicly discloses suppliers.



## **Palm oil scorecard rating C**

Example: Only 20% of their supply chain volume is RSPO certified. They fell at least 50% short of their CSPO targets.





# The Accountability Framework initiative

The **Accountability Framework initiative (AFi)** is a collaborative effort to accelerate progress and improve accountability for supply chain commitments in agriculture & forestry.

The **Accountability Framework** provides common definitions, norms, & guidance that bring greater clarity, consistency, effectiveness, & accountability to the implementation of these commitments.

 IS	 IS NOT
A global 'public good' intended to be used as a resource by companies and others	A commercial product or service
A set of norms and best practices for setting, implementing, monitoring, & reporting on company commitments	A certification program or standard
Working to align monitoring, reporting, and assessment initiatives and tools	Conducting its own assessment, rating, or benchmarking of company performance

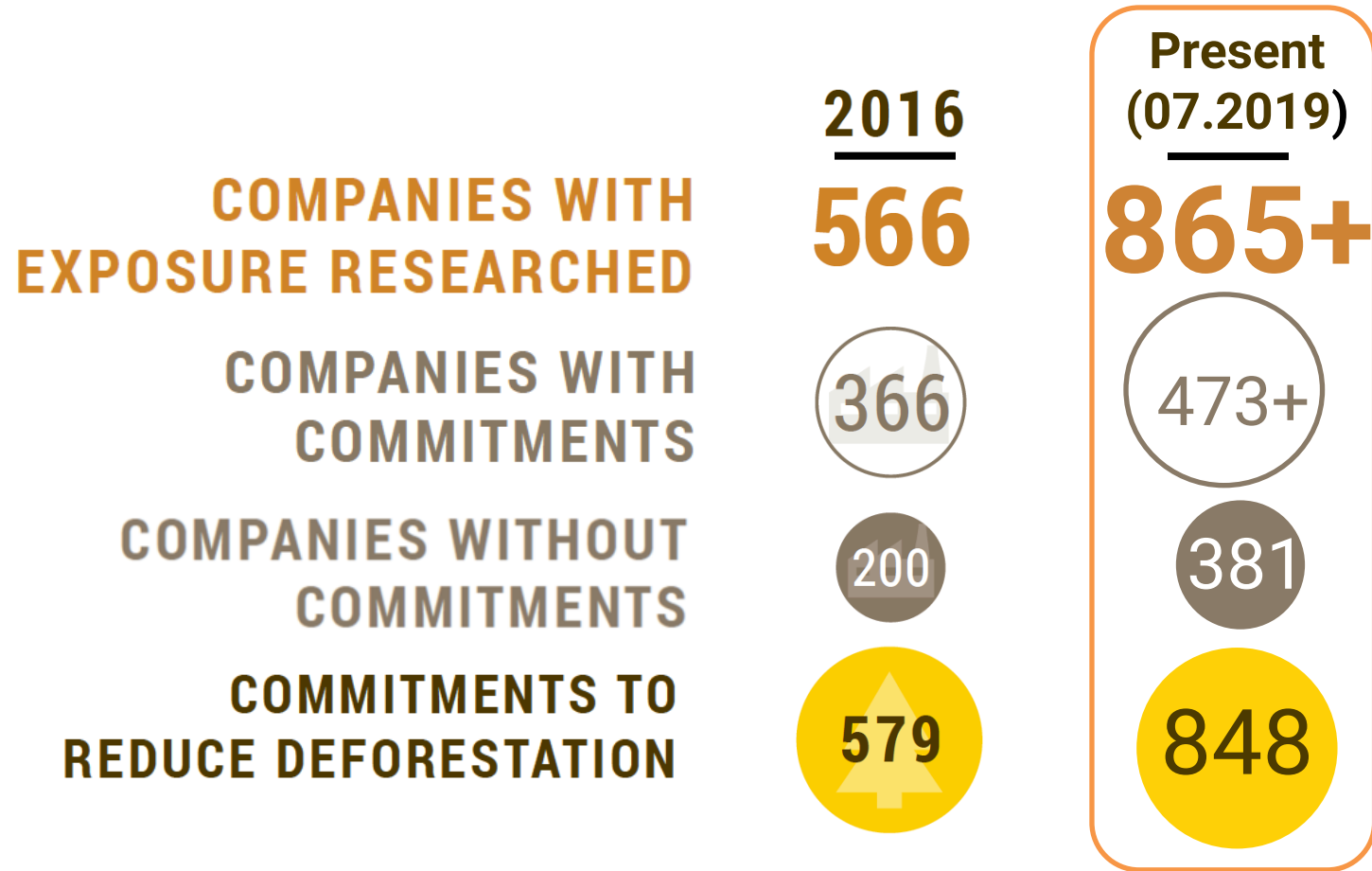

# Accountability Framework Guidance on Reporting

**Core Principle 12:** Progress and outcomes related to the implementation of commitments are reported publicly on a regular basis. These reports reference and adhere to common definitions and good practices for conveying precise and verifiable information.

- ✓ At least once a year, companies report on the status of progress toward meeting their commitments.
- ✓ Companies disclose information on their suppliers, supply origins, and the nature and status of non-compliances and grievances

COMPONENTS	ELEMENTS OF EFFECTIVE REPORTING
Company exposure to environmental and social risk	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Should be comprehensive; any exclusions clearly identified</li></ul>
Management systems & activities related to implementation of commitments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Report on relevant implementation activities in the context of full scope of company operations</li></ul>
Degree of traceability and control in the company's supply chain	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Proportion of supply chain volume traceable to each supply stage</li><li>• Proportion of volume for which the level of compliance is known</li></ul>
Outcomes of commitments related to both compliance and outcomes on the ground	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Degree of compliance with commitments across commitment scope.</li><li>• Comprehensive measures of outcomes related to implementation of commitments.</li></ul>

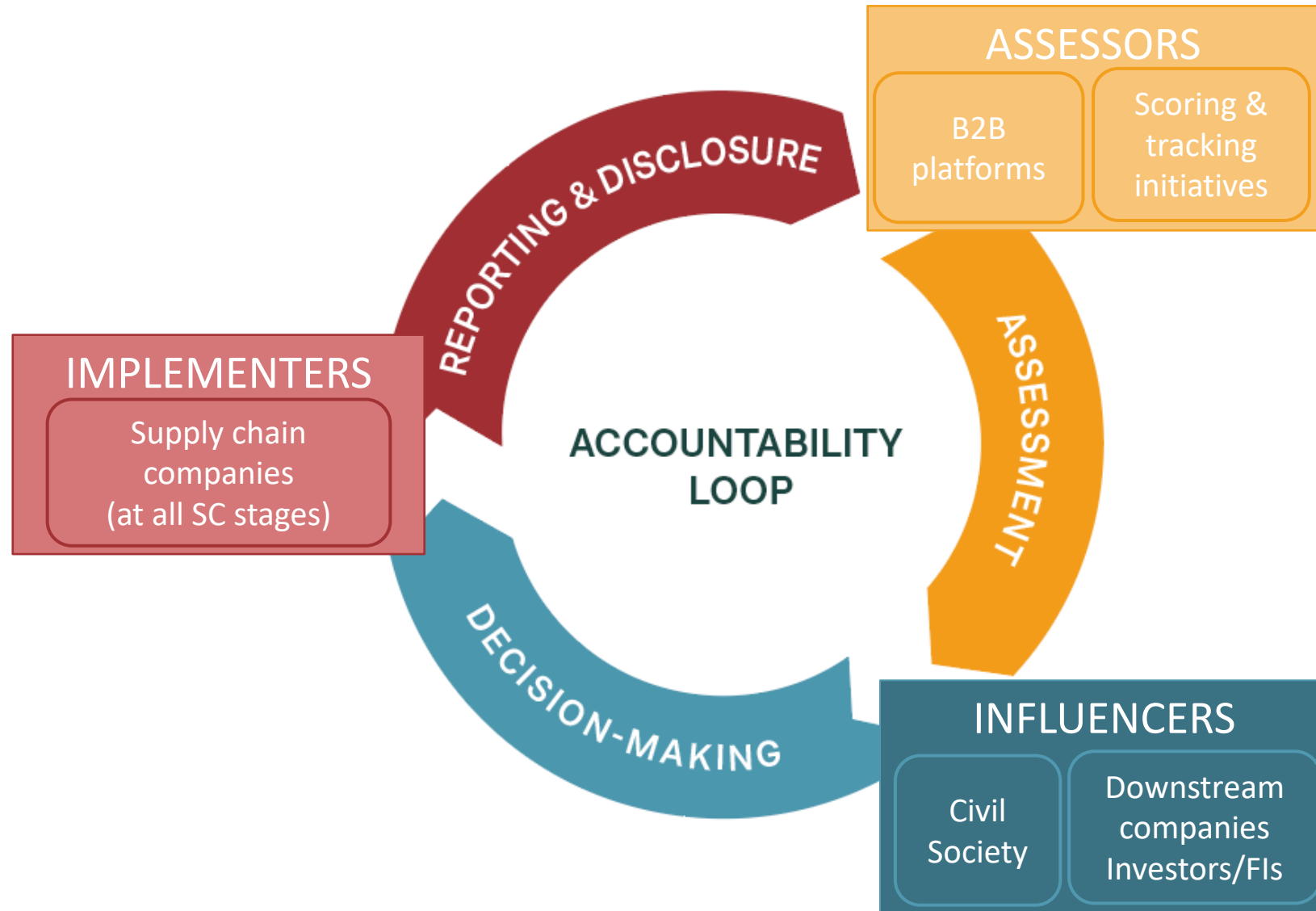

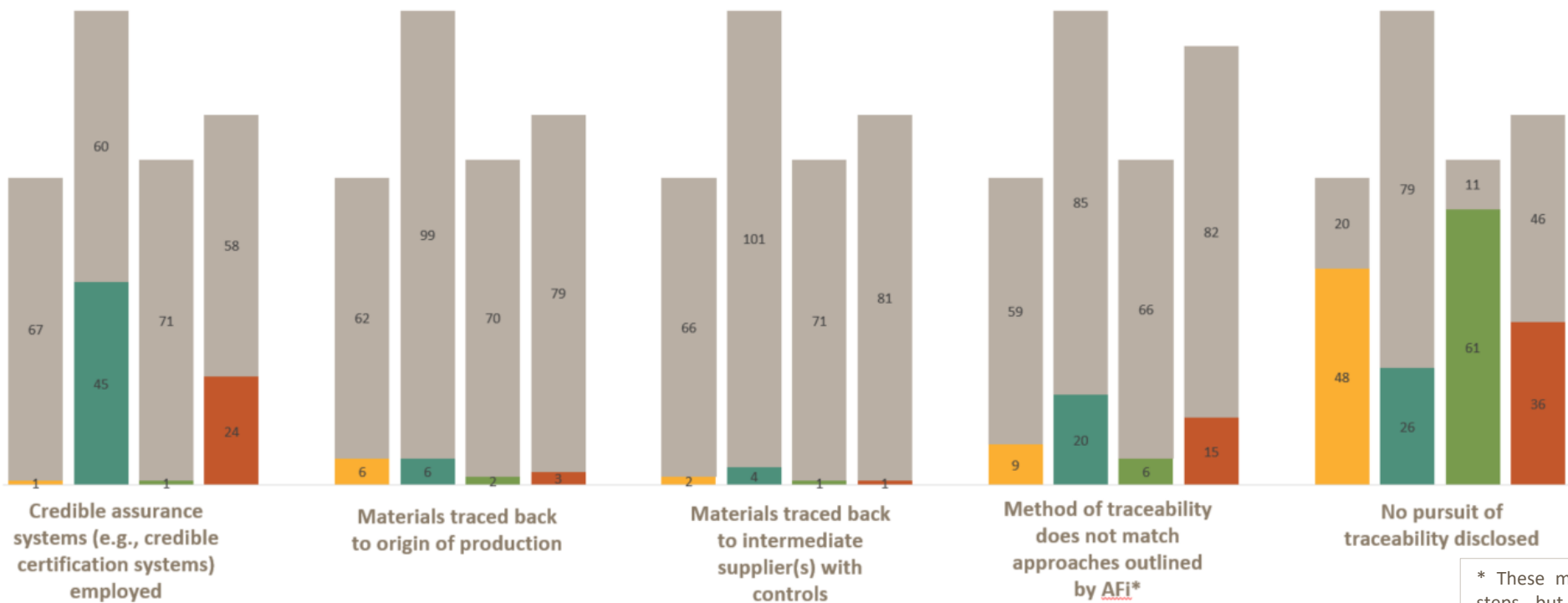
