

# The implementation gap

Large international company sourcing palm oil

Two very different takes from different scorecards on whether this company is 'ethical':



#### Palm oil scorecard rating A

Example: Has substantial traceability of palm oil to the plantation level. Participates in initiatives to reform the palm oil industry. Publicly discloses suppliers.



#### Palm oil scorecard rating C

Example: Only 20% of their supply chain volume is RSPO certified. They fell at least 50% short of their CSPO targets.



# The Accountability Framework initiative

The **Accountability Framework initiative** (AFi) is a collaborative effort to accelerate progress and improve accountability for supply chain commitments in agriculture & forestry.

The **Accountability Framework** provides common definitions, norms, & guidance that bring greater clarity, consistency, effectiveness, & accountability to the implementation of these commitments.





## Accountability Framework Guidance on Reporting


**Core Principle 12:** Progress and outcomes related to the implementation of commitments are reported publicly on a regular basis. These reports reference and adhere to common definitions and good practices for conveying precise and verifiable information.

- ✓ At least once a year, companies report on the status of progress toward meeting their commitments.
- ✓ Companies disclose information on their suppliers, supply origins, and the nature and status of noncompliances and grievances

Company exposure to environmental and social risk	Should be comprehensive; any exclusions clearly identified






