Call for Consultancy: Study to understand the timber industry in Nigeria

SCOPE OF WORK

Forest Trends is commissioning a study that seeks to understand the timber industry in Nigeria. The study should be framed around the following research questions:

Characterize key elements of the timber industry:

- 1. Number of EU focused export operators for timber, sawnwood and other timber products excluding charcoal (approx.)
- 2. Number of Asia focused export operators for timber, sawnwood and other timber products excluding charcoal (approx.)
- 3. Characterize the export oriented charcoal industry
- 4. Location of sawmills are they clustered in a particular area?
- 5. Indicate % of production covered by Chain of Custody (CoC) certification, including the schemes, broken down by product type.
- 6. Indicate % of production area covered by Forest Management (FM) certified claims, including the schemes, broken down by product type.
- 7. Identify commonly traded species (including protected species)
- 8. Outline the extent of plantations and plantation species
- 9. Characterize the species of timber destined for a) regulated markets in Europe, US and Australia; b) key processing hubs such as China and Vietnam

Identify relevant Nigerian legislation:

- 1. Key legislation that applies to the forest products industry in Nigeria including an understanding of the Nigerian Export Ban for logs and sawnwood.
- 2. Completion of a Forest Trends table to collect information on the latest provisions and exemptions under the export ban.
- 3. Relevant state and national legislation including logging and export bans.

Identify common cross-border smuggling activities

- 1. Characterize regional cross border smuggling routes for timber and associated wildlife trade/contraband leading in and out of Nigeria.
- 2. Identify main ports of export for smuggled timber, as well as any other identifiable characteristics if possible (eg notable species, markings, companies or individuals).
- 3. Outline what, if any, element of the smuggling is Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) listed species and any CITES specific modalities/routes.

Global trends

- 1. Any industry or macro-economic factors that have affected Nigerian exports in the past 5-10 years (e.g. any introduction or revisions of export or import taxes, etc).
- 2. After initial identification of any major, new, or interesting trend, provision of more detail. E.g. sudden jump in imports from Country X. Why?

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Interviews with 15 key actors in industry (concessionaires, processors, agents, EU importers).
- 2. Field based interviews and research where necessary to validate findings (eg of uncontrolled smuggling routes).
