1. State of Investment in NbS for Water Security - Report Launch & Dissemination Support Launching in May 2025, the State of Investment in Nature-based Solutions for Water Security analyzes hundreds of data sources—databases, government reports, surveys, and expert interviews—to present an objective, data-driven benchmark of global NbS finance motivated by water. The report identifies where funding is flowing, what's driving it, who is paying for it, and what challenges remain. This report offers the most comprehensive global assessment to date, building on Forest Trends' State of Watershed Investments 2016.

You will help us maximize visibility and uptake of this new report. You'll track outreach and engagement, draft content for social media and blogs, identify presentation opportunities, and package data insights for partners and donors.

- Develop a dissemination tracker to monitor outreach, uptake, and engagement by target audiences (e.g., donors, DFIs, utilities, NGOs).
- Connect to improving/consolidating contact and stakeholder management for Forest Trends' Global Water team.
- Draft social media posts, blog content, and spotlight summaries for different regional audiences.
- Support identification of opportunities for presentations or partnerships (conferences, webinars, roundtables, blogs).
- Consolidate ideas for deeper dives into the data & package for potential partners/donors.

2. Strategic Storytelling & Impact Snippets

Bring our work to life by collecting and crafting short stories that highlight impact and lessons learned from our work scaling-up investment in NbS to address water risks in Peru and elsewhere. You'll also help develop a storytelling toolkit and collaborate on content for blogs or presentations.

- Collect and package 3–5 short stories or "snippets" that showcase our work and its impact
- Assist in preparing a storytelling toolkit or template to capture future stories in real time.
- Collaborate with staff to turn one or two stories into blog posts or slides for future outreach.

3. Proposal Pipeline & Landscape Scan

Support fundraising efforts by researching funders focused on nature-based solutions for water.

You'll prepare donor profiles, conduct a funding landscape scan, and summarize our approach for potential funders.

- Conduct a landscape scan of major funders investing in Nature Based Solutions (NbS) for water.
- Prepare 1–2 donor profiles with history, priorities, and strategic entry points.
- Prepare short (1 page) summaries of our approach and key opportunities for potential donors

Desired Qualifications & Skills:

- Strong research and writing skills (English fluency required; additional languages a plus)
- Interest in environmental issues, policy, or international development
- Desire to be part of a small team and learn from experienced professionals in the field
- Proficiency with Microsoft Office (Excel, Word, PowerPoint)
- Experience with graphic design or data visualization a plus, but not required
- Experience in communications, marketing, or development a plus, but not required
